Doctorate in Behavior Analysis or a program with primary behavior analysis content. ABDs will be considered but doctorate must be conferred at the time of appointment. Current BCBA certification. ABA Supervisor Training and at least on year providing supervision consistent with BACB standards. ABA teaching and/or training experience.

Preferred Qualifications

ABA research productivity (publications and presentations). Online teaching experience. Experience coordinating academic and/or training activities. Experience in academic advising. Ability to work effectively with students and colleagues.
